Duties and Responsibilities

The Intern will primarily assist the department in the following ways:

- Work with Cataloguer daily on research for specific works of art to prepare them for sale
- Visit local libraries for department research
- Compile data into appraisals and proposals to assist with business-getting
- Help Sale Manager prepare client-facing documents during the pre-sale process

The Intern will additionally have the opportunity to:

- Participate in auction-day roles for sales across all departments
- Record sale results for Phillips sales and our competitors
- Assist with ad-hoc research projects and auction-related tasks

The Intern will benefit from the following enrichment experiences:

- Tour Phillips' Long Island City warehouse and shadow Cataloguer during artwork inspection at the beginning of the internship
